Combined Arms Center Announces 9th and 10th (Horse) Cavalry's Capital Campaign for New Frontier Army Museum

FORT LEAVENWORTH, KS – The Combined Arms Center congratulates the 9th and 10th (Horse) Cavalry Association representing the Buffalo Soldiers for embracing an ambitious capital campaign to expand the Frontier Army Museum at Fort Leavenworth.

The 9^{th} and 10^{th} (Horse) Cavalry Association's campaign will fund the construction of a reimagined Museum that will be built outside of the gates of the military post to increase access to the public and better serve the community.

With more than 6,000 artifacts in its collection, visitors to the new facility will learn about the challenges, customs, and cultures of the Army before WWI. In addition, they will also better understand the importance of Fort Leavenworth in the exploration and expansion of the nation throughout the nineteenth century as well as its continuing role in soldier education.

Currently in the conceptual phase, the vision of the new museum is to provide a robust educational experience and join the landscape of iconic destinations for American history enthusiasts visiting the Heartland. Not only will the public experience the rich history of the Army from 1804-1917 but this new destination will provide significant economic impact for the area. The Army is excited about the commitment of the 9^{th} and 10^{th} (Horse) Cavalry Association to help make this effort possible.


The Frontier Army Museum collects, preserves, and safeguards material culture of the United States Army and uses its holdings to support Professional Military Education, collections-based research, the development of educational materials, and educational initiatives to inform the public concerning the history of the Frontier Army, the Combined Arms Center, and Fort Leavenworth.

The original collection began in 1938 when the wagon shop at Fort Leavenworth closed and the horsedrawn vehicles were relocated to the "Old Rolling Wheels Museum." It was officially recognized as an Army Museum in 1960 and has continued to preserve one of the finest collections of nineteenth century military artifacts in the country.

To date, explorers have mapped and surveyed more than 412 miles of cave passage, making Mammoth Cave by far the longest known cave system in the world. The explorers are still discovering new passages, and they often say that "there is no end in sight." The name "Mammoth" was first used to describe the cave in the early 1800s. It refers to the "mammoth" size of the cave's chambers and avenues. From the beginning of the Mammoth Cave's re-discovery by modern man, African Americans played a vital role in every era of its rich history. Their work and contributions helped to shape the cave to what we experience today. They were some of the first tour guides and workers creating and shaping it into its current beauty. In the video You meet Ranger Jerry Bransford whose ancestors worked and shaped and provided tours of the caves. We had the honor of meeting him and having him do our tour. The National Park Service Rangers have an awesome plan for our youth and adults who will be joining us on the amazing adventure. 

Army promotes Kentucky's Charles Young to Brigadier General Posthumously

He was third Black graduate from West Point, and was a Colonel upon retirement. In a letter dated Nov. 1, 2021, Under Secretary of Defense Gilbert Cisneros Jr. informed the chairs of the U.S. House and Senate Armed Services committees of his decision to approve the request, and Secretary of the Army Christine Wormuth informed Charles Young's family of the promotion on Jan. 19, 2022. "Charles Young was a pioneer, especially in his military career, but also throughout his life," said Gov. Beshear." Charles Young was born in Mays Lick, Kentucky, to enslaved parents in 1864. He valued education throughout his life and graduated with honors from high school in Ohio, where his parents' escaped slavery. Young taught elementary school and eventually entered the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, New York, where he was its third Black graduate. He went on to become the first Black military attaché to a foreign country and served in various assignments from Haiti and Liberia to Mexico and Nigeria. When he was medically discharged from active duty, Col. Young was the highest-ranking Black officer in the military, having been promoted to colonel. 
